Martin Kolais is one of 6 children of Pastor Wilfred Wanjala Nakhokho, he was a small scale farmer and Pastor of Murkwijit Bible Baptist Church. He was also a teacher in the West Pokot Baptist Bible Institute. A very faithful man of God. Along with his wife Joyce, who is also a teacher in the Bible Institute of ladies. Together they served the Lord side by side in the ministry.

On August 22 of 2004 Pastor Nakhokho who was also a builder and brick layer went with a group of other Pastors in his fellowship to help to lay a floor in a new building going up in Kechaliba. They had worked all morning laying stones for the foundation of the new church building. When it began to rain. Because there was only a roof over the floor and no walls yet. The rain was blowing in on the men as they worked.

They decided to go into the old church building for shelter until the rain stopped. Pastor Nakhokho set in a chair by a window and was leaning up against the wall. He has his eyes closed because of the heavy labor of the day, he was tired and decided to rest a little. A large bolt of lightening hit the building, which was built from tin (iron sheets) and flashed through the building, throwing everyone inside to the floor. Alter it was over, everyone stood back up and one small child had been really injured, (he died later at the hospital) in all the excitement of checking on the child and making sure no one else was injured. No one noticed that pastor Nakhokho had not moved from his chair and was still leaning up against the wall with his eyes closed. They went to check on him and to wake him, or see why he had not moved and gone out of the building with the rest of them. But he, still sitting in his chair was dead.

The children with their mother live in a small three room house made of mud with iron (tin) sheets as the roof; on their plot of land where their father was buried. They all share one room. They carry their water from the river to the house. There is no electricity anywhere around them since they live way out in the countryside. They eat only what they can grow. They hope to go to school so they can be educated and get jobs when they are grown.

They live in a small three room house. The yard is used for planting food so they can eat. There is no play area for the children since eating is much more important than playing. The children all have to work in the gardens that are planted so they have enough food to eat. Since there is no cold season here in Kenya they can grow vegetables the entire year around.
